

For the March 17, 2021 COVID-19 positive test report, we have one new Nursing Facility resident test positive for COVID-19 and we have not had three or more residents or staff with new onset of respiratory symptoms occurring within 72 hours of each other. Through contact tracing and a risk assessment for this Nursing Facility resident it was determined that they did not have any prolonged close contact with any other residents during their potential infectious period. This resident was admitted recently to our observation Villa, Villa Clare Garden, and has remained quarantined to their private room their entire stay.

Therefore, cumulatively to date since March 2020 we have a total of:

We continue to take the necessary infection prevention and control measures to limit potential exposures which includes, but is not limited to, contact tracing, testing the residents and staff, creating cohorting zones and wearing appropriate Personal Protective Equipment as per the Pennsylvania Department of Health and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) guidance.

Per current CMS recommendations we will have to stop in door visits until at least one round of facility-wide testing is completed. Consistent with CMS rules, all staff and residents that tested negative will be retested every 3 days to 7 days until testing identifies no new cases of COVID-19 infection among staff or residents for a period of at least 14 days since the most recent positive result.

Per CMS guidance visitation can resume based on the following criteria:

- If the first round of outbreak testing reveals no additional COVID-19 cases in other areas (e.g., units or villas) of the facility, then visitation can resume for residents in areas/units with no COVID-19 cases. However, the facility should suspend visitation on the affected unit until the facility meets the criteria to discontinue outbreak testing. For example, if the first round of outbreak testing reveals two more COVID-19 cases in the same unit as the original case, but not in other units, visitation can resume for residents in areas/units with no COVID-19 cases.
- If the first round of outbreak testing reveals one or more additional COVID-19 cases in other areas/units/villas of the facility (e.g., new cases in two or more units), then facilities should suspend visitation for all residents (vaccinated and unvaccinated), until the facility meets the criteria to discontinue outbreak testing.
